So this Christmas season and next year I challenge you to look for small ways everyday to be generous.



MCOC from the Beginning

When MCOC was founded, its first focus was collecting gently used clothing for the community. While we have expanded our services and created new programs, we don't want to forgot our core mission... giving good clothing to those in need. Right now, we are doing that at an alarming rate and serving more people weekly than we ever have in the 5 years I have worked here.

In October & November combined we gave out clothing to 1,711 people made up from 453 families. Each person can receive 3 pants, 3 tops, 1 coat, 2 pairs of socks, 2 pairs of underwear, 1 pair of shoes, gloves, hats and other accessories. Most people are leaving with a minimum of 10 clothing items (usually more in the winter if we can). So in the last two months, we have given out over 17,000 individual clothing items! Right now we need warm clothing boots, coats, sweaters, pants etc.

We need your help reminding people that we are <u>ALWAYS</u> accepting clean gently used clothing for our shopping floor.
